Sibling-owned logistics business fuse passion with commitment to develop growth plan and expansion

We are celebrating the success and growth of the business owned by two young brothers this youth month. Mokgaetji and Malose Makgabeng are the co-owners of youth-owned company, Makgabeng Taxi Tours, a logistics company based in Mokopane, which supplies business passenger and commercial transport solutions. Established in 2019, the company offers custom employee transport services, logistics, plant hire and tourist services.

In 2022, Makgabeng Taxi Tours joined the SAICA ED Financial Excellence Programme, one of the new initiatives introduced by Anglo American Zimele as part of our Enterprise and Supplier Development Programmes in our host communities.

Implemented through a partnership with SAICA Enterprise Development (SAICA ED), the programme aims to address pertinent financial management challenges that are faced within communities' enterprises. The Makgabeng siblings joined the programme with the goal to address the lack of financial management skills and inability to grow their business.

The determined siblings assessed the targets to define their value proposition and diversify their service offerings. The coaching sessions delivered through the programme helped the owners with planning processes to control the costs associated with running their business. This cost management process allowed the business to predict future expenses and reduced the chances of budget overruns.

"Both Mokgaetji and Malose Makgabeng diligently attended their monthly virtual financial excellence coaching sessions and completed all tasks assigned to them. This commitment meant meeting their development goals to diversify their business offerings. Through financial analysis and growth coaching, the owners were able to implement effective changes in the company and add more vehicles to their fleet," says Thabo Mongatane, Small to Medium Enterprise practitioner and programme coach. Makgabeng Taxi Tours expanded their services to include plant hire, logistics and tourism. This also now allows the owners to manage different aspects of the business and expand on their professional development.

"I have learnt hugely from working with our business coach. Apart from learning about business finances, I have gained the confidence to market our services to clients outside of mining. We have been able to define our value proposition and can confidently look into the future," says Malose.

It is clear that hard-work and commitment has paid off for the Makgabeng siblings. The business has grown from strength to strength. Highlights of growth include the implementation of new cost management strategies, expanded fleet and service offerings, up-to-date monthly management accounts, the development of a clear business growth plan and the co-owners have been equipped with greater business acumen and financial management skills to confidently grow their business to the next level.

Year two of the CHIETA Small Business Support **Programme**

In December 2022, The Hope Factory celebrated the official close to their first pilot Small Business support programme together with sponsoring strategic SETA partner, The Chemical Industries Education & Training Authority (CHIETA). The CHIETA Small Business Support programme, was a 12-month business and finance development programme targeting the Chemical industry. The programme closed with 30 Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) based in Nelson Mandela Bay and Buffalo City Municipality, Eastern Cape.

This year we launched the second phase of this project with year two, selecting 20 graduates from last year's group. The second-year phase of the programme started in January and will be ending in November. The programme consists of 4 participants in the petroleum industry and 16 participants in the Chemical manufacturing industry.

The main aim of this second phase programme is to:

- 1. To build on the foundation created during Year 1 of the programme.
- 2. To continue to address the main challenges experienced by the SMMEs.
- 3. To ensure business growth for each SMME.

Customised projects in De Aar come to a close

Together with strategic partner, Solar Capital De Aar and Solar Capital De Aar 3, SAICA ED implemented two Enterprise Development programmes in De Aar, Northern Cape. The pilot project in early 2022 was birthed from Solar Capital De Aar's desire to continue to create impact for SMME's within the De Aar region helping to bring about transformation by educating and nurturing candidates through their economic and Enterprise Development.

In partnership with Solar Capital, we were able to coach 8 local start-up SMMEs within the De Aar network towards being sustainable and productive businesses that can contribute to the local economy and bring about improved social economic conditions for the community at large. The next 4-month programme started in November 2022, to boost an existing ED programme that Solar Capital De Aar 3 already had in place. SAICA ED came along to offer more training and support for a further 8 local SMMEs.

37.5% of the SMME's grew in turnover.

11 new jobs created (including interns, casuals and permanent.)

All candidates and businesses showed improved knowledge and skills that were implemented and reflect in company change.
